JULIO ESCALONA (Madrid, 1963) received his doctorate in 1996 by the U. Complutense de Madrid. He is currently Investigador Científico at the Instituto de Historia - CSIC and belongs to the Research Group *Power Networks in Medieval Societies*. He is Honorary Senior Research Associate of the Institute of Archaeology (University College London, UK) and full member of the Society of Studies on Agrarian History (SEHA).

Research: His research combines history and archeology for the study of European societies of the Early and High Middle Ages, in three main areas:

- The study of territory, society and power in medieval Europe.
- The analysis of medieval written sources from the point of view of historical memory, political discourse and document forgery.
- The application of Information Technologies to research in Medieval History and Archaeology (especially database design and e-mapping).
